## PRAYERS

Mrs. Appolloni, seconded by Mr. Fleming, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-372, An Act to honour industrially caused handicapped persons, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

Mr. O'Sullivan, seconded by Mr. Darling, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-373, An Act to provide for the recognition of the Beaver (*Castor canadensis*) as a symbol of the sovereignty of the Dominion of Canada, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

Bill C-40, An Act to amend the Excise Tax Act and the Excise Act, was again considered in Committee of the Whole, and progress having been made and reported, the Committee obtained leave to consider it again at the next sitting of the House.

By unanimous consent, the House reverted to "Motions".

Mr. Pelletier (Hochelaga) for Mr. Trudeau, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Copies of list of economists who advise the Prime Minister on matters of economic importance.—Sessional Paper No. 301-7/8.

*(Public Bills)*

The Order being read for the second reading and reference to the Standing Committee on Labour, Manpower and Immigration of Bill C-209, An Act to amend the Canadian Citizenship Act (minimum residence requirement);

By unanimous consent, Mr. Prud'homme, seconded by Mr. Watson, moved,—That the Bill be not now read a second time but that the subject-matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Broadcasting, Films and Assistance to the Arts.

After debate thereon, the question being put on the motion, it was agreed to.
