pass through the alimentary canal before a large portion of their nutritious materials has been absorbed. Cattle should go out every day to water. If kept on the board floors all winter they are apt to become lame, partly from want of exercise, and partly from excessive growth of the hooves, which in spring-time will be found projecting forward like Chinese slippers.

MARCH.—The nature of our climate necessitates the use of a hot-bed for raising seedling plants of those crops that require a long season to mature. A hot-bed is made by piling on successive layers of well chopped horse dung obtained from a stable where oats are freely fed. The manure may be raised to a height of two or three feet above the surface of the soil. On top, spread four or five inches of very fine and rich soil; this should have been prepared in the Fall, and kept dry under cover all winter,—otherwise it is likely now to be in a hard frozen mass. The glass sashes are then to be put on and kept close till the hot-bed heats; the steam and heat will start the seeds of weeds, which may be allowed to grow. Air
