

Under Imperial Postal Regulations.

OTTAWA, Sept. 10.—All necessary arrangements will be made for transmitting letters between the men of the Canadian overseas force and their re-latives and friends at home. There are fifteen men of the postoffice de-partment engaged at the Valcartier camp now, and a certain number of them will go with the contingent. They pass from the control of the postoffice department of course, and are entered under military control.

As soon as the contingent is bonded As soon as the contingent is handed over to the imperial authorities the latter will regulate all postal arrangements. The men at the front are not allowed to reveal their location when writing, and special post cards have been provided for them by the French and British Governments.
