Experimental Stage Passed and Trading Was Active at Advance.

## FOR EXPORT BUSINESS

Fine Display and Strong Tone in Heavy Steers-Values Up.

The receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards on Friday numbered 91 cars, including 551 cattle, 90 cal. es, 281 hogs, 556 sheep and dambs and 670 horses.

Export Cattle.—After three trials, and in the face of yesterday's fine display and strong tone, the Friday market for heavy steers passed out of the experimental stage, and looks to be well established. The trading was active, and the most of the 800 cattle on sale (including those shipped in on Thursday for this market) passed over the scales by ten o'clock. The prices paid averaged 10c to 15c advance over Friday a week ago. Values ranged from 37.75 to \$8.06 for the heavy, fat kind. Several buyers intimated that if still heavier beeves of the good kind were offered they would shove the top price up a notch or two. Shippers who have been waiting to see how events would turn out would be well advised to let a share of their large steers out, as there is a keen shipping demand for the best quality stuff, averaging 1400 lbs. and o.er.
