XIV. For every cord of wood taken up within the limits mentioned in the preceding article, and carried as far as Palace-gate, there shall be paid one shilling

and fix pence.

XV. For every hundred of boards taken up within the limits of the thirteenth article, and carried to any part of the Upper-town, as far as the Jesuits College, or any other place equally distant, there shall be paid three shillings and nine pence, and for carrying the same to any greater distance within the gates nine pence, over and above the three shillings and nine pence; and for the carriage of every hundred of planks, taken from the said Beach, and carried to any part of the Upper-town, as far as the Jesuits College, there shall be paid five shillings, and for the carrying the same to any greater distance within the gates, there shall be paid nine pence, over and above the said five shillings.

XVI. For every hundred of boards ten or twelve feet long, taken up in the Lower-town, and carried to the Upper-town, as far as the Recollets or Jesuits College, there shall be paid four shillings, and for any greater distance within the gates eight pence, over and

above the faid four shillings.

XVII. For every hundred of planks of ten or twelve feet long, taken up in the Lower-town and carried to the Upper-town, as far as the Recollets or Jesuits College, there shall be paid for the carriage thereof six shillings and six pence, and for any greater distance within the gates one shilling and six pence, over and above the aforesaid six and six pence.

XVIII. For every load confissing as is mentioned in the first article, to be taken up in the Upper-town
