BASEBALL'S BUSY MONTH THREE LEAGUES TO MEET

Eastern, National and American in New York the Week After Next.

NEW YORK, Nov. 30.—President Thos. J. Lynch of the National League yesterday notified the eight member clubs of the league in the major organization that the annual convention of the National League of Professional Baseball Clubs will be held on Tuesday, Dec. 13, at two o'clock p.m., at the Hotel Breslin, in this city.

At the same time Mr. Lynch issued a call to the members composing the league, and the board will be held at the same hotel on Wednesday, Dec. 14, at two o'clock p.m. All of which means that baseball is still alive and kicking. The active baseball campaign was dumped into the discard more than a month ago, but the minds of baseball followers have not been taken off their favorite pastime for any extensive period. First the official American League batting averages were carefully gone over, and yesterday the National League batting marks were announced.

A day after the Eastern League confab the Nationalists will go into executive session, and once more the presidency of the league will be discussed. It is more than a month ago Lynch was eliminated by a good many as a presidential possibility, but since then the few nationalists who threatened to bolt against Lynch have forgotten their grievances, and it is stated from an authoritative source that Lynch will direct the destinies of the National League for one more year.

On Wednesday of the same week the American League will hold its annual meeting at the Hotel Waldorf. At this session, however, the presidency will not be involved, for President Ben Johnson has still to serve nineteen years of his twenty-year term, which was voted him at the last meeting.

President Frank J. Farrell of the New York Highlanders left for Hot Springs, Va., yesterday afternoon. He will remain there for a week or so, and then return to the American League meeting.

OLDEST PRIZE FIGHTER DEAD

Jem Macs, Once Champion of England, Passed in Seventieth Year.

LONDON, Nov. 30.—Jem Macs, the noted old English fighter, died to-day, aged 70 years. Macs was at one time Britain's greatest pugilist, and made, as he himself termed it, "barrels of money" in the ring. He was a native of Devon, and was a member of the Devonshire Militia. Macs began his career as a pugilist when he was 20. His first opponent being a formidable English boxer by the name of Black, whom he put out in the fifth round after 15 minutes of fighting. This was on Oct. 2, 1855, at Millfield, and it was the first time that a British boxer had ever defeated a foreigner in the ring.

Macs continued his fights, meeting all of the leading English pugilists, and was declared a champion of England. He was a member of the Devonshire Militia. He was a member of the Devonshire Militia.
