WATER EXPERTS ON THE JOB

Visited Mimico Point Yesterday and Will Go to Lake Simcoe To-day

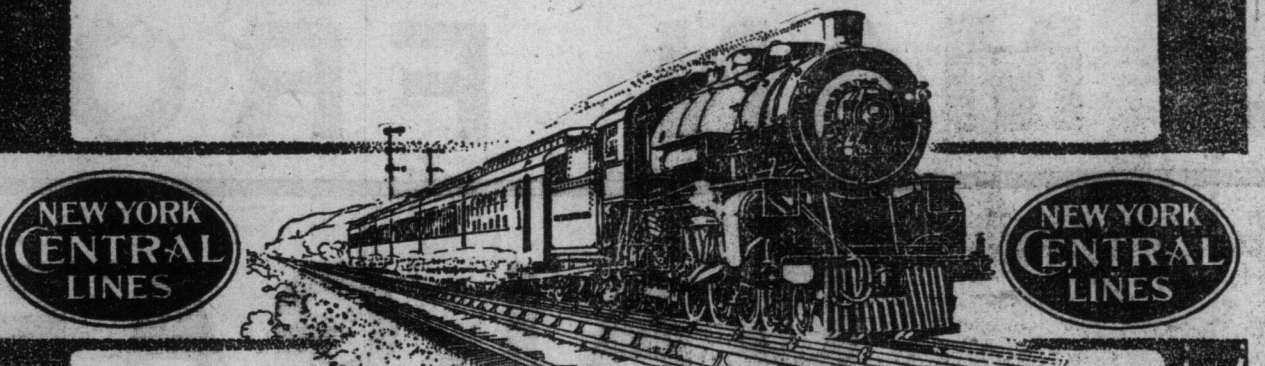
The city's board of water experts, J. G. Sing, William Randolph, Willis Chipman and T. A. Murray, met yesterday and resumed enquiries into the present and future water supply. They paid a visit to Mimico Point yesterday afternoon and propose going up to Lake Simcoe this morning. They have been prevented from continuing the work they started some weeks ago, through the illness of Messrs. Sing and Randolph, and the absence of Mr. Murray. The cut at Clarendon-avenue is completed with the exception of the removal of a few stones and some piling. The water from Blockhouse Bay is pretty well closed out and the water from Long Pond has been turned into the settling basin.
