PREMIER DOES HIS WORST AGAINST TWO-CENT FARES

Opposes House Going into Committee on the Bill and Sees No Reason Why Canadians Should Emulate United States in Securing Cheaper Rates - Six Months' Hoist is Voted.

Ottawa, Feb. 25.—(Special).—House bill No. 8, introduced by W. F. Maclean (South York), to amend the Railway Act by establishing a minimum passenger rate of two cents a mile came up in the house to-night upon the adverse report of the railway committee.

Mr. Maclean pointed out that during the past week the two-cent fare had been established in seven states of the American Union, and it was in course of adoption by eight other states.

TWEEDIE MAY SUCCEED


One of Several Possibilities for Vacant Lieutenant-Governor.
