Hamilton, April 21.-(Special.)-Just what At the Assizes.

In the action of House v. the Grant-Lottridge Brewing Co., in which W. R. House claimed \$10,082, on two notes of \$4490 and \$4500 and interest, judgment to flay was given for the full amount.


