Two Parties Reach Here On · Sunday Off Troop and Hospital Ships.

Two parties of returned soldiers from overseas service arrived in the city at 8 o'clock Sunday morning. A party of 9 officers and 124 other ranks off the S. S. Regina detrained at the Quebec street station of the C. P. R., from which point the members proceeded directly to Tecumseh Barracks, where they were immediately demobilized by the staff of No. 1 District Depot.

A party of 37 mulitary patients which crossed the Atlantic on the hospital ship Essequibo, docking at Portland, Maine, Friday, arrived at the Grand Trunk downtown station yesterday morning, travelling in special hospital coaches.

Upon arrival at Tecumseh Barracks, the veterans were met by the civic reception committee and conveyed to Carling Heights in motor cars.
