STRUCK AT DEPTH. Cobalt Central Finds Good Over 300 Feet Deep.

NEW YORK, Nov. 17.—A telegram received at the office of the Cobalt Central Mines Company from Jacob W. Young, superintendent at the mines at Cobalt states that the diamond drill this morning cut a new vein at a depth of 310 feet from the surface, running at right angles at the vein struck three weeks ago on to the vein struck three weeks ago on the third level of the Big Pete Mine. The new vein, it is said, averages over 3000 ounces of ruby silver per ton, and shows native silver plentifully shot in the wall-rock of several feet on both sides.
