C.N.R. TO BUILD AT ONCE TORONTO-OTTAWA LINE

Several Surveys Made, and Road
Will Probably Branch Off at
Richmond Hill.

Tenders will be called for by the C. N. R. on Saturday for the construction of the first hundred miles of the Niagara-Ottawa branch, which will pass thru Toronto. Chief Engineer Stewart will start to-day on a final inspection of the various routes which have been surveyed, and his report, together with the reports from the surveyors, will be filed at the head office of the company in time to permit of a final choice of the right of way as soon as the contract is let, so that construction may be started.

Vice-President D. D. Mann, interviewed by The World yesterday, said that the line would be diverted at several points from the route originally fixed, but he was not prepared to indicate at present as to where the amended lines would be run. All would be known in time.

One of the lines surveyed by the company eastward flanks the C.P.R. on the north for some distance east of Leaside Junction and it was hinted in railroad circles yesterday that this would

The opinion prevails that the line will branch off from the present C. N. R. road in the vicinity of Richmond Hill and will keep on the elevation north of the C.P.R. track for a distance of about ten miles before crossing to the south.
