

Notice of motion was given for grants toward support of missionaries at Lockeport and Mills Village, and the applications were referred to the "Quebec Scheme" Committee.

The following were appointed a sub-committee to co-operate with a sub-committee of the Synod in making arrangement for a public meeting during the Session of Synod:—Rev. R. Shreve and Messrs. W. M. Brown and R. J. Wilson.

MAY 21st, 1875.—With reference to the unconsidered portion of the Report of the "Quebec Scheme" Committee, recommending that the minimum salary be \$800; it was—

Resolved,—"That the subject be brought before the General Meeting, and that the Secretary, together with Messrs. W. C. Silver and W. M. Brown, be a sub-committee to bring it forward with all necessary information and such suggestions as the Executive Committee approve."

With reference to grants for Missionaries at Lockeport and Mills Village, the "Quebec Scheme" Committee recommended the Executive Committee to defer the considerations of those applications until the operations of the present year shall shew how far grants for new missions may be within the power of the Society.

A grant of \$30 was made toward repairing the Parsonage at Port Medway.

An application was read from the Wardens at Arichat for an increase of the grant to the Clergyman there. It was the opinion of the Committee that no further aid could now be given.

It was directed that during the vacancy at 'Guysboro' fifty dollars of the present grant be paid to the Clergyman officiating there, on condition of \$75 being paid by the people.

The Secretary submitted a draft of the 37th Annual Report of the Executive Committee, which after emendation was adopted.
