Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 6th inst. - 11,438 - , and, in compliance with your directions, I, on the 22nd inst., proceeded to the Reserve, accompanied by Deputy Sheriff Smith, (whose absence, prevented my doing so sooner,) found Brown, who, I refrained from arresting, as he promised to come up here next day, pay the costs, and leave the Reserve.

He came up, paid all the sheriff's costs \$14.96, and my \$2.22 for carriage hire & tolls, and, he is to remove by the 1st prox.

Some others have returned to various parts of the Reserve, (complaints made to me today,) who, I propose to deal with in the same manner as with Brown, and, as I shall no doubt discover more, in the

*course of my drives, take your authority to exercise my discretion, and I shall not commit any one, except in a case of necessity, while, I shall incur no cost, not collect by the Sheriff no "no good" I am for
