We cannot tell what view the people of New-Brunswick may take of the question at issue between their Representatives and the Legislative Council—but this we know, that if the former are not sustained in the contest which has been so anxiously forced upon them, we would give very little for all the good they will do for the next seven years. It allowed to be thus driven to the wall—beaten down in a manner so reckless and arbitrary—and, when compelled to assert it, stripped of their constitutional privileges, it is not likely that their usefulness will long survive the wreck of their dignity and independence. We hope better things, however; and although the tone of a portion of the Press be rather unpromising, we sincerely trust, that the Council will be ultimately rebuked; by a stern and overwhelming expression of public opinion. When His Majesty's Council in this Province thought proper to jeopardize the Revenue, and throw the country into confusion, had at least the excuse that they were resisting a new tax, and seeking to lessen the burthen of the people; but the rash Lords of New-Brunswick have not even this ground of justification; they have brought on angry collision, and cancelled the appropriations, because they could not compel the Assembly to sanction a novel expenditure, of very doubtful utility, and which had undergone no discussion among the mass of the population, from whose pockets it was to be paid.
