WIND YOUR WATCH AT NIGHT, HE SAYS

That is Conclusion of Watch Maker After Study of Breaks.

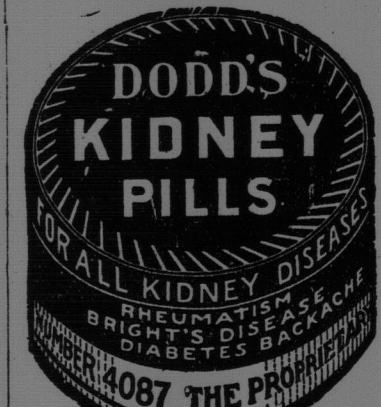
Wells River, Vt., Feb. 20.—Harry Holton, a modest watchmaker of this town, who has been studying watch springs for about a quarter of a century and keeping a careful record of all watch spring breakages which have come to his attention, has just announced the discovery of why watch springs break.

Briefly, it is the result of winding one's watch at night, instead of in the morning.

Spring Gives Way
After carefully recording 75 watch spring breakages during a period covering a number of years, Mr. Holton found 70 occurred following the winding of the watch at night. From this fact, and other confirmatory expert evidence, Mr. Holton has worked out this solution:

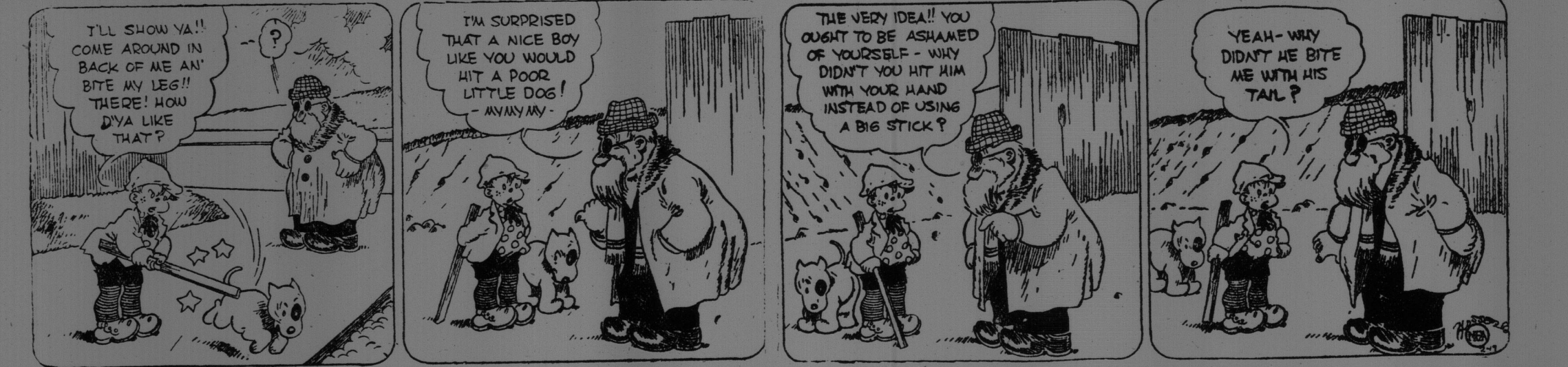

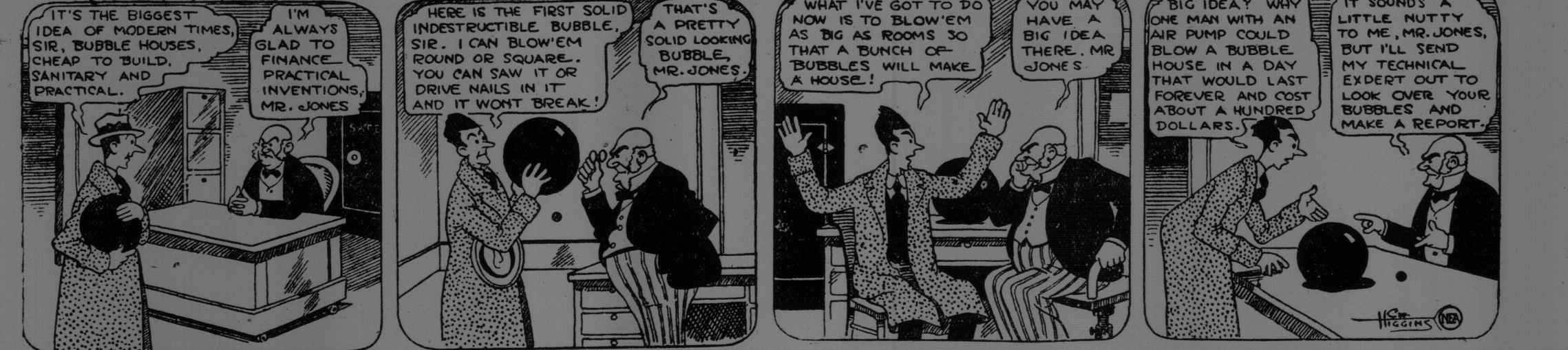
