Fredericton, N. B., Feb. 22.—The department of lands and mines intends to extend its system for protection of the N. B. forests from fire during the present year and will ask for considerable expenditure. Seventy-five thousand dollars will be required.

DISCUSSES NEAR EAST.

(Fredericton Gleaner.)

Lieut. Col. J. Carleton Brown, who is visiting his former home here for the first time since his return from Constantinople, where he had several years service with the British forces in the Near East, is uncertain as to his plans for the future, he said today.

"If there is war in the Near East," he said, "I am under obligation to return. If there is a good peace upon equitable terms, I shall be glad to return as the opportunities will be great; but if the Allies do not get the right peace terms, I will have no desire to return."
