HUNTING SEASON
OPENS TODAY

The open season for shooting wild ducks, geese, brant, coots, gallinules, rails, woodcock and jack snipe begins today in this province and will continue until December 31, except in the case of woodcock and jack snipe, which cannot be legally shot after November 30. The bag limits are twenty-five ducks, fifteen geese, fifteen brant, fifteen plover, twenty-five jack snipe, and tan woodcocks per day. The use of powerboats, sail boats, sunken boats or airplane are forbidden and no shooting can be legally done at night. The big game
