GREAT GAME IN WEST ST. JOHN

Giants Shutout Courtenays in One of the Most Exciting Games of the Season

The Giants defeated the Courtenays last evening on the Queen Square grounds by a score of one to zero in one of the most interesting and exciting games played so far in the series to decide the championship of the West Side Baseball League. Upwards of 1,000 fans witnessed the contest and their interest was manifest by their excited cheering and cheering. The result of the game was always in doubt and it was not until after the fifth inning when darkness came on that it was finally settled.

The Giants won the toss and took the field and quickly disposed of the first three men of the Courtenays. They in turn failed to score and from that until the last of the fourth inning neither side was able to get a man around the bases. In this inning the Giants scored, Milan going to first on a clean hit and after taking second on an infield out scored on Larry Garnett's two bagger.

In the first of the fourth the Courtenays threatened to break up the game. They got a man first, hit by the pitcher, and immediately afterwards an error allowed a runner to reach the bag in safety. An infield advanced both runners and the following batter struck out. The next batter sent a slow grounder in the direction of third base, which was fielded by the Giants' pitcher. Instead of taking a chance of a long throw to first with a new and slippery ball, he hurried quickly, threw to third and caught the runner off third bag. A mistake not chasing him up resulted in his hitting the third baseman and reaching the bag in safety. This play brought forth tremendous applause from the Courtenay rooters, as the bases were filled, but the following batter failed to hit safely and the side was retired. As the Courtenays failed to take the first of the fifth the game was called by Umpire McAllister. A bat catch by Milan in right field was feature of the game.
