Ottawa, Nov. 29.—Just before the close of the sitting of the house tonight, the question of harbor improvements at St. John was brought to the attention of the house by Hon. Dr. Pugsley, who urged that Norton Griffiths' tender be accepted and that an immediate start be made with the work.

As a citizen of St. John he urged Mr. Hazen to use his efforts to have the Courtenay Bay work speedily completed at once and completed as soon as possible and to take the credit for it. For his own part, Dr. Pugsley said, that he would be in favor of the launching of the project, he was willing that Mr. Hazen should have the credit, if the work were carried out.
