





UNITED FORWARD MOVEMENT OF CHURCHES BEGINS

f the Protestant churches was launched throughout the dominion yesterday. In the city churches the messages from the nouse of prelates of the Anglican church, of the general asembly of the Presbyences of the Methodist and Congrega-tional churches were read. Inspiring addifferences were listened to and special music and prayers marked the occasion as a most notable one in the history of Christopher and the control of the co tianity in Canada. London, Sept. 20—(By Mail)—The Secretary of State for War announces that the directorate of Graves Registration and Enquiries is unable to receive any further applicants for photographs of graves in the various theatres of war, but that it is hoped that the requests already received will be completed before the close of the present year.

The work of photography was originally undertaken by the directorate owing to the prohibition on military grounds of the use of private cameras in France, and as otherwise relatives would have had no other means of obtaining a photograph of a grave. The joint war committee of the British Red Cross and Order of St. John have generously provided sufficient funds for the purpose of supplying the cameras and the material required, but contributions from these funds will cease on the first of October. Moreover, as there is now no prohibition on the taking of photographs, the necessity for the work done by the military photographers, attached to the directorate of Graves Registration and Enquiries, no longer exists.
