

MEDICAL OFFICER'S REPORT, 1887.

There has been a good deal of sickness in the House during the past winter, consisting of severe colds, and diseases incident to old age and broken constitutions, but very little, if any, attributable to unsanitary conditions of the Institution.

Thirteen persons have died in the House up to date, and three among the casuals; all from chronic diseases of very long standing. Those in the House averaged $73\frac{1}{4}$ years of age, while the three casuals averaged 57 years each.
