I am ZE-2539 Capt J.Y. Gosselin, Adjutant of the Royal 22e Regiment, RCIC, Canadian Army (Active Force) and have been since 14 January 1949. As Adjutant, I have the custody of the Regimental books of the Unit and the documents of the accused, whom I recognize as SE-103583, Private G. GONTHIER, Royal 22e Regiment, RCIC, Canadian Army (Active Force).

I produce the following documents, all referring to the accused, SE-103583, Private Guy Gonthier:

- (1) Certified true extracts of Part II Orders of the Royal 22e Regiment, Canadian Army (Active Force) No. 39 dated 10 June 1949, No. 41 dated 29 June 1949.
- (2) MFB 375, being certified true copy of the Record of the Declaration of the Court of Inquiry, inquiring into the absence of the accused dated 28th of June 1949, and duly certified by me as Adjutant and Officer having custody of the original record.
- (3) Certificateof surrender of the accused in accordance with AA 163 (1) (1) purporting to be signed by SE-6080 L/Cpl A. Desgagne, C PRO C, on strength of Royal 22e Regiment, RCIC.
- (4) Certified true extract of the Royal 22e Regiment, Canadian Army (Active Force) Part II Order No. 79 dated 3 November 1949, showing the accused taken on strength upon surrender.

The accused declines to cross-examine the witness.
