His Excellency, on the recommendation of the concrable the Minister of Customs and underthe provisions of the said Act has been pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order in Council of the 22nd day of May, 1868, and the Regulations thereby establised be and the same are hereby repealed, and that the following Regulations be and are hereby adopted and established in lieu thereof—that is to say.

1 Upon the importation of swine for the purpose of slaughter, the Importer shall enter the same for Warehouse, upon the usual form of such entries, stating upon its face, the number and value of the berd, and also the quantity of spock bacon, hams and lard, which the ...mber tates will produce when slaughtered and dressed at 13 pounds weight for each live hog so imported, and the amount of duty to which such produce is or may be liable under the rate prescribed by the tariff in force at the time being as the proper duty on meat of that kind. Such Importer shall then execute a bond to the Queen, in double the mount of such duty, the condition of which bond shall be, that upon the due exportation within one year of the sald products of the swine so imported and converted into pork, bacon, hams and lard, or pa ment of the duty secured by the sair bond, then the sald bond shall be and become mand void, otherwise shal remain in full force and virtue. and void, otherwise shall remain in full force

Upon the reception into the Bonding Ware, house, the swine shall be regarded only as meas, and it shall not be lawful to remove any of them from such Warchouse all ve; nor shall any part of the produce of such swine be removed there from, for any purpose, without a permit from « Collector, or proper t fficer of Customs, as in the case of all other bonded goods.

3. Swine imported in the carcases to be cured ond packed in bond, may be entered in the usual way for Warchouse, and be placed in the premises essablished as a Warchouse of this class for the special purpose of curing and packing. The
