SMOKING ON THE STREET

IS AGAINST THE LAW.

But Fortunately the Law is Not Enforced—St. John Has Many Such

Dead Letter Enactments.

This city has never lacked by-laws regulating the conduct of its inhabitants. Many of the civic ordinances, however, have become obsolete, while others are practically dead letters and seldom, if ever, enforced.

There can be little doubt that some of the unenforced by-laws are impracticable and to enforce them would be exceeding the limit of reason. The old regulation prohibiting smoking on the streets might be instanced as an example of puritanical unreasonableness. It would be hardly correct, however, to include this old regulation in the class of unenforced by-laws. It is many decades ago since it was enacted by the then civic authorities and its proper place is with the obsolete.

To come down to more modern times, there could be no better example of a by-law falling into disuse than that prohibiting spitting on the sidewalks and in public places. No person with a spark of reason in him could question the good results to be derived from the strict enforcement of such a regulation. But the difficulty here arises, as undoubtedly it does in many similar cases, from the fact that the persons who originated the by-law, as well as the persons whose duty it is to enforce it, are as likely to be in default as the greatest mass whom it is intended to reach. It has been said, in a journal, that were this by-law prohibiting spitting carried out in every instance with unflinching impartiality, the city's debt would soon vanish and the terminal improvements required to place St. John in the foremost position of winter shipping ports on the Atlantic seaboard would spring into existence with magical promptness.

A by-law which is seldom enforced to the letter is that relating to public shows and exhibitions, passed by the common council in 1894. Probably the only class of public exhibition which is brought within the purview of this law is a travelling circus. The object of the law is, of course, to subject shows and exhibitions to a license fee before performing in public, and circuses coming to town have invariably been compelled to pay the maximum amount of two hundred dollars. As regards dramatic and theatrical performance, the law has never been enforced, though there is not the slightest doubt that it could were the mayor, who is the executive official in all matters relating to licenses, so disposed. Even amateur performances and entertainments for religious, charitable or philanthropic objects, might be obliged to pay a license, but in such cases the mayor is specially given discretion to dispense with that preliminary.

Another by-law which is honored more in the breach than the observance is that relating to the dumping of coal and fire-wood upon the sidewalk. The penalty for this offence is two dollars and the duty of enforcing the law is placed upon the police magistrate. Though people are occasionally reported by the police they are seldom fined. The law plainly says that fuel must be unloaded outside the curbing.

A person has only to be present to know that teams quite frequently move faster than a walk on the North and South Market Wharves, and yet the driver who permits such a thing is liable to a fine of two dollars, were the law enforced. To allow a horse to stand unsecured on the street without an adult person in charge is, according to civic ordinances, a punishable offence, but no one in recent years has been pulled up for it. Owners of wagons and carriages not in actual use have no right to allow them to stand on the street, and yet this prohibition is generally winked at.
