Defective Balance for the Can

The making of a pilot is a long and arduous task. The Air Service, from the very beginning, has been a wonderful and extensive centre of the great Canadian Air Force, where a young man, after a year or more in training, he graduates from the King's College, a sergeant and pilot. There are two classes in the air service. One is of officers and the other is of enlisted men with wings.

Before the young man can be accepted for training, he must pass a series of tests. The first test is the "spinning test," which is a test of endurance. The second test is the "balance test," which is a test of physical strength. The third test is the "stunt test," which is a test of agility and coordination.

After the young man has passed these tests, he is accepted for training. He then goes to the Air Service School, where he will receive a thorough education in all the branches of aviation. He will learn to fly, to land, to take off, and to perform all the other duties of a pilot. He will also receive instruction in the theory of flight, in the construction of aircraft, and in the maintenance of engines.

When he has completed his training, he will be a qualified pilot. He will then be assigned to a squadron, where he will continue to receive instruction and to gain experience. He will also be responsible for the safety of the aircraft and the lives of the crew.

At this school he has
