Moncton, Aug. 18.—(Special)—G. O. Dwyer, the well known building contractor, suffered a stroke of paralysis today and slight hopes are entertained for his recovery. The Seelye-Polley case was concluded in the police court today, the complaint being dismissed. The case is one of the most remarkable ever tried in this city.

When the prosecution closed its case this morning the defense asked for dismissal without admitting evidence. After argument the application for dismissal was granted. W. B. Chandler, E. A. Reilly applied for the prosecution, and D. I. Welch and Hon. F. J. Sweeney for the defense. The police magistrate in dismissing the information passed severe strictures on the nature of the case and of evidence adduced against the accused. He declared there was not a particle of evidence to show that Polley made fraudulent representations to the Seelyes to induce them to buy stock.

The court also made severe criticisms on criminal prosecutions generally, declaring that half of the criminal cases brought were for blackmailing purposes. The state of things in criminal prosecutions in Moncton was said to be rotten and a disgrace to the city, and the sooner the citizens awakened to the fact and effected a cure the better for the city and all concerned. Some of the cases brought against Polley should be frowned down by all honest citizens.

G. M. Jarvis, I. C. R. district superintendent, of Truro, held an inquiry this evening into the railway picnic fatality in which Watson Gross lost his life. A sensation was created today by the finding of clothing on the bank of the Petitcodiac, which was identified as belonging to a young man named Harley Bleskney. The first supposition was that the young man had been bathing and was drowned or committed suicide, but on investigation made by the police it is believed tonight that Bleskney will be found on the bank as a blind. He is a son of J. R. Bleskney and has a wife living here. He recently came home from Montreal and had intended returning with his wife tonight.

Moncton, Aug. 22.—Some time ago Wm. Steeves, the well known lively stable proprietor, reported the loss of a horse, which was stolen from a stable in his coat as the latter was hanging on the wall of his office. At the time of the theft Mr. Steeves suspected a young man named Gould, who was working for him. Gould belongs to Memramook, and shortly after the robbery was committed, was observed spending large sums of money at Memramook, through back to a party afterwards Gould went to the United States, accompanied by a lad whom he induced to leave his home in Dorchester.

A short time ago Mr. Steeves went to Boston, where Gould had been located, and took with him a letter of introduction to the Boston police from the local authorities. Gould could not be located in Boston, but it was ascertained that he was in Worcester (Mass.) Thither Mr. Steeves accordingly went, with a letter of introduction from the Boston police to the Worcester chief of police. Gould was identified by him, and today a telegram received in this city announces that Gould has been arrested and is being held by the authorities on the charge of bringing stolen money from Canada into the United States. A large sum of money was found on Gould's person. If the charge is proven, the alleged thief will be sent back to Canada, but will be sentenced in Worcester on the charge on which he is now being held.

Harley Bleskney, whose clothes were found on the bank at the foot of Foundry street Friday, was Saturday morning seen by Conductor A. Robinson, of the Elgin & Hallowell Railway, standing on the end of the train, and that he through back to Glenville, where, when the train started, he was seen lying by the water tank. Conductor Robinson identified the man on the train between Elgin and Petitcodiac. Bleskney's disappearance from Moncton is a rather peculiar one, and why he left the gold watch and chain in the clothes on the shore is somewhat perplexing.
