There is already in existence a naval reserve company at Victoria, and a petition was sent to the government recently on behalf of this company, asking for co-operation of the naval department in furnishing funds and instructors. It was also suggested that the Rainbow could be utilized during the coming summer for training purposes instead of being kept uselessly tied up in harbor, as was the case last summer. Admiral Kingsmill is now on his way out to Victoria to see what arrangements can be made regarding this.

organize a naval reserve company there. So far as the lakes are concerned, the training of course will at first have to be of a very elementary character, but it is suggested that later on small training cruisers may be secured along the same lines as have been adopted for the American service on the great lakes. In the maritime provinces it is proposed to give the fishermen who are already expert seaman, a chance to get a touch of naval service each year by utilizing the Niobe and the fisheries protection cruisers. For the Atlantic service the same lines as have been adopted in Newfoundland under admiralty supervision will be followed.

It is expected that a start towards the development of the whole scheme will be made this summer, but it will take a year or so before the organization can be completed, and anything like a moderately efficient naval service in Canada can be built up. Meanwhile the government is apparently going to leave its dreadnought contribution policy quiescent.
