McKAY, JOHN, M.D. (*West Victoria*).

S. of the late James McKay of the Tp. of Finch, Co. of Stormont, who came from the North of Scot., and was one of the pioneers of the eastern district of Ontario. B. in Finch, 12 Feb., 1841. Ed. at the Public School, and at Upper Canada Coll. Graduated M.D. in McGill Coll., Montreal. Studied medicine also in London and Edinburgh. M., 13 Aug., 1875, eldest dau. of Rev. Dr. McTavish, now of Inverness, Scot. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1890, and re-elected at last g. e. A Liberal.—*Woodville, Ont.*

McKEE, WILLIAM J. (*North Essex*).

Great-grandson of Col. Thomas McKee, an officer in the English army, who settled in Essex Co. about 1780, and represented the Co. in the second Parlt. of Upper Canada from 1796 to 1802. B. at Sandwich, Co. of Essex, Ont., in 1851. M., Oct., 1873, Mary, eldest dau. of the late Charles Baby, Esq., Sandwich, and grand-dau. of Hon. Jacques Baby, a mem. of the first Parlt. of U. C., and at one time Speaker of the Leg. Council. Is a lumber dealer and manufacturer of sash, doors, etc. Has been a mem. of the Co. Council of Essex, 11 years mem. of City Council of Windsor, and 6 years Chairman of Board of Water Commrs., Windsor. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g. e. A Liberal.—*Windsor, Ont.*

McLAREN, ALEXANDER J. (*Hastings East*).
