MR. OLIVER J. WILCOX, a farmer of South Woodslee, near Windsor, Ont., has performed a great feat. He carried the Federal constituency of North Essex against the Laurier candidate who was chosen to succeed the Hon. R. F. Sutherland on his appointment to the Beach. The his appointment to the Bench.
