As a result, UNB led the game by a score of 12-10 at the end of the first half due to tries by Rod McDonald and

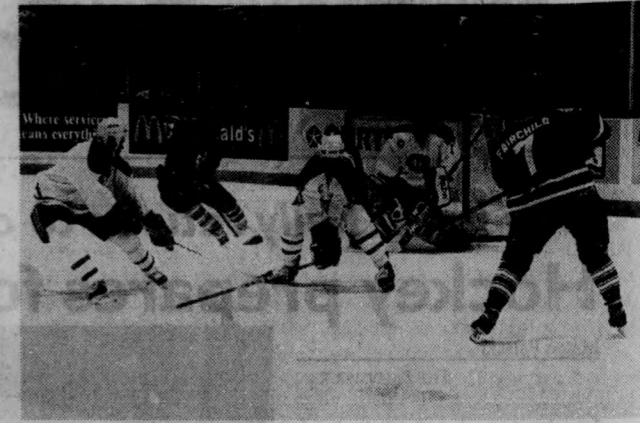
Jeremy Nibogie. Jason Robertson successfully converted the second try.
