	2nd Dec. 1942		Snowing. High winds. Mr. Gregory Clark, feature writer for The Toronto Star, visited the Station, procuring material for an article for his newspaper.	
	3rd Dec. 1942		Snow. High Winds. Physical Training and Drill for Training Wing personnel.	
	4th Dec. 1942		Overcast. Snowflurries. Very poor flying weather.	
	5th Dec. 1942		Overcast. Snow showers. Headquarters Squadron held a dance in the Recreation Hall this evening, over three hundred being in attendance. The R.C.M.P. Orchestra provided the music for the evening.	
	6th Dec. 1942.		Clear. Divine Services were held in the Recreation Hall this morning. At 1330 hours, Harvard aircraft 3278, piloted by LAC Michell, J.D., R145198, closed from behind and above on approach to land, and collided with Harvard aircraft 3113, piloted by Corporal Boileau, L.C., R53392, the wing tip striking and breaking the coupe top on aircraft 3113. Both pilots uninjured, and both landed their aircraft at the main aerodrome with no further damage.	
	7th Dec. 1942.		Cloudy to overcast. Scattered snow showers. Very little flying.	
	8th Dec. 1942.		Clear. Training Wing took advantage of the clearing weather, and were able to put in a good day's flying.
