

right of way of the Pacific Great Eastern railway; thence South westerly following the said limit one thousand six hundred and six feet and six-tenths of a foot more or less to the North limit of an extra-width of the said right of way; thence easterly along the said North limit and the said North limit produced eighty-three feet and twenty-two hundredths of a foot more or less to the water's edge of Seton Lake; thence North-easterly following the said water's edge to the point of commencement, as shown on a plan of survey made by Chas. T. Hamilton, British Columbia Land Surveyor *dated* 7th June 1920, a copy of which is of record in the Surveys Branch of the Department of Indian Affairs under number IRR 1895-C.
