Dear Sirs:

Mr. Mackenzie King has received here your letter of the 11th instant, addressed to him in care of the Rockefeller Foundation, New York. The letter was forwarded from New York to Mr. King's permanent address at The Roxborough, Ottawa, Canada, was returned to New York just too late to reach Mr. King before he left for Chicago, and has just been received here.

Mr. King asks me to explain that at the moment pressure of other engagements makes it impossible for him to send a personal acknowledgment. He has asked me, however, to express his regret that, having made no special study of profit-sharing plans in this country, he is not in a position to advise on these matters. Mr. King understands that a department of the National Civic Federation of New York has given considerable attention to this subject, from the point of view of Labor's attitude towards profit-sharing, and he suggests that you might be interested in arranging to get their publications.

Such views as Mr. King holds on the subject of profit-sharing have been outlined in the volume, "Industry and Humanity", which was published last month by the Houghton Mifflin Company, of Boston.
