Dear Mr. Atkinson:

I thank you and Mrs. Atkinson very heartily for the invitation you have so kindly extended to me to spend the wesk-end with you in Toronto before going up to North York. I shall be very pleased indeed to arrange to be with you on Sunday, August 1st, unless, perchance, you should find it equally convenient to substitute Sunday. the 15th of August.

I expect to address a meeting at Centre Island on the afternoon of Saturday the 14th, and to be back in North York on Monday the 16th.
