Just a few lines to ask you if you could make me understand, how is it that once a person, was enlisted in the Robinson Treaty, seven years ago. Till Mr Remsey from Ottawa was here, off. course, there were a lots of cases to look after all right, about: who should be rubbed off: such, as Indians who are marrying White Men: and they came to my case, saying my husband was a white man and not drawing Treaty money: but I never could make them understand: that he is a white man, his, an Indian as well as the rest, that's in this Reserve: so they said either, my children shouldnt get Treaty or, Entrance money: And this is what I want you to make me understand, why is it that my husband could be rubbed off: his Robinson Treaty, it wasint the agreement Queen Victoria made, when she first paid out the Robinson Treaty to Indians, my husband was drawing the Treaty till the year, 1888 his mother had died then, and he was quite a young boy, and being so much, out of town his father had not time to come in town to draw their treaty money, so its plain to see he was not rubbed off purposely by the Department. So if things were looked over carefully, I've got the rights for my children at least to draw, the Robinson Treaty and Entrance
