

Summary of Evidence in the case of No. H-46310, Private William ANDRYCHUK, A.15 Canadian Infantry Training Centre, C.A., a soldier of the Canadian Army charged with Desertion.

THE COMMANDING OFFICER DIRECTS THAT THE EVIDENCE BE TAKEN ON OATH.

FIRST WITNESS.

No. L-13343 Sergeant Eric Hubert MEALING, A.15 Canadian Infantry Training Centre, C.A., having been duly sworn, states:-

"I am No. L-13343 Sergeant Eric Hubert MEALING, A.15 Canadian Infantry Training Centre, C.A., Administrative Sergeant of "E" Company."

WITNESS QUESTIONED BY THE PRESIDING OFFICER

Question: "Do you recognize the accused?"

Answer: "Yes Sir" -- (indicating him)

Question: "I show you this document, what is it?"

Answer: "It is an M.F.B. 375, showing the accused absent from 0530 hours, 28th September, 1942."

Document produced and marked Exhibit "A".

Question: "I show you this document, what is it?"

Answer: "It is an M.P.M. 215, showing that the accused, designated in the document as No. H-46314, Private ANDRYCHUK, William, surrendered to R.C.M.P. at Shaunavon, Saskatchewan, at 11.30 A.M. on the 6th December, 1942."

Document produced and marked Exhibit "B".

Question: "I show you this document, what is it?"

Answer: "It is an M.F.B. 1481, showing itemized transportation account in the case of the accused, designated H-46310, Pte. U. ANDRYCHUK, R.C.C.C., from Gull Lake to Regina, \$10.57"

Document produced and marked Exhibit "C"

Question: "I show you this document, what is it?"

Answer: "It is an M.F.B. 1482 in the case of the accused, designated as No.H-46310, Pte. W. ANDRYCHUK, R.C.C.C., showing expenses of R.C.M.P. at Shaunavon and incidental expenses at Regina amounting to \$7.24."
