SCOTLAND.

A village on lot number one, first and second concessions, township of Oakland, eleven miles from Brantford, fourteen from Simcoe, fourteen from Paris, and two from Oakland. The post office was established in 1855. The village contains two Churches—Baptist, Rev. Robt. Montgomery, and Congregational, Rev. Wm. Hay. The Grammar School averages about twenty-five pupils; the junior department averages eighty pupils. The chief manufactures are a grist mill, a woollen factory and a tannery, the latter is capable of turning out one thousand hides per annum.
