as Tolsmaville, is a village at a good harbor
on the island of the same name, in the north
channel of the Georgian Bay, forming
Cockburn township, district of Algoma, and
about 80 miles south-east of Sault Ste Marie,
the county seat, and 150 from Collingwood,
the nearest bank location. Steamboats call
regularly, thrice a week during navigation.
The township contains about 45,000 acres of
good land, and ships fish, ties, telegraph
poles, cedar posts and paving blocks in large
quantities. It contains Episcopal, Presby-
terian and Methodist churches, and 3 public
schools. Population, 750, Mail tri-weekly.
