## HOMESTEAD

### REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitolas or the North-west Territories, excepting 8 and 3g, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood tost for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 countries of the second of the secon

Entry may be made personally at the local land offer for the District in which the hald to be taken in situate, or it the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$010 is charged for a homesteed entry

### HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendmenta thereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans:—

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patient may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in themamer pre-scribed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon tarming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

### APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before the second of the Homestead Inspector is the second press in months to the in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so.
