Mr. Haviland, accordingly appeared at the Bar.

On Motion, for the order of the day, the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, to resume the consideration of the Bill intituled an Act to ascertain and limit the jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace in matters of Small Debt."

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, ...

The Attorney General took the Chair of the Committee,

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair,

The Attorney General, Chairman of the Committee reported, That they had

examined various witnesses on the subject matter of the Rill, and that the Committee had thought it unnecessary to examine any other evidence.

mittee be agreed to.

Dr. M. Aulay moved for leave to bring in a Bill to repeal an Act, intituled "an Act to repeal an act made and passed in the forty-first year of his late Majesty's Reign, intituled air Act for the better regulation of Elections, and to regulate Elections for Members to serve in General Assembly in future;" which was granted, and on Motion received the first reading.

Mr. Campbell moved for leave to bring in a petition signed by John Lord, on be-shalf of the Inhabitants of half Lot Number Twenty-eight. Leave being granted the same was read.

Mr. Campbell moved that the said pe-

tition do lie on the Table.

Mr. Makey moved as an amendment, that the said perition be received by this House, as the petition of John Lord only.

The Question being put, the amendament was carried.

A Message from His Majesty's Council, by Mr. Carmichael, their Clerk.

Mr. Speaker,

His Majesty's Council have agreed to the Bill to revive and perpetuate an Act intituled "an Act to enable the Justices of the Supreme Court of Judiciture, to issue Commissions for examining with nesses out of this Island," with an amendment, to which they pray the concurrence of the House of Assembly.

Ordered, That the Attorney General, Mr. Hodgson, and Mr. Cameron, be a Committee to confer with a Committee of his Majesty's Council thereon.
