THE PROPERTY LOSS WILL BE ENORMOUS

Winnipeg, June 24—It is impossible to calculate the property damage caused in the Province but if the Portage La Prairie estimate is anywhere near accurate the aggregate loss will probably run to nearly \$3,000,000 as the destruction of property in Winnipeg is said to run into the hundreds of thousands.

Farmers in the Portage district, where crops are reported to have been literally cut down by hail, were registering claims late yesterday with insurance companies with which they had been insured and it is believed the majority affected had protected themselves against the elements. But city property owners will in most cases have to bear the loss themselves as it is not a general practice to take advantage of "tornado" risks, according to local companies. The ordinary fire insurance policy mentions that it does not protect the property owner in case of damage caused through acts of God.

Beaverbrook's Part In Asquith's Fall

Considerable speculation has arisen over the authorship of the book "Pomp and Power" just published, the writer dealing with matters of high policy and persons having the handling of them in a style showing his intimate acquaintance with both. The author of the book is a warm friend of France, and while unhesitatingly criticizing Premier Lloyd George, fully recognizes his achievements and abilities.

Revelations in the book concerning the fall of the Asquith ministry are particularly interesting. The writer says: "It was difficult to see how matters could be brought to a crisis except by Lloyd George himself taking a personal risk which he was always disposed to do. He wanted rebellion from within which would oust H. T. Asquith and carry him to Downing St. In many respects the details of the intrigues are still unknown or obscure. The person who had the greatest part in carrying them to a conclusion was Lord Beaverbrook (then Max Aitken) but it is doubtful whether he conceived the original idea. The probability seems to be that it originated with others and it was while casting around for some one to influence Bonar Law that they disclosed the project to Aitken."

LLOYD GEORGE, CHURCHILL DERBY

The author declares that the only two people of whose opposition Lloyd George had any fear are Right Hon. Winston Churchill, Secretary of State for the Colonies, and Lord Derby. For Winston Churchill's power to be unpleasantly pugnacious the Premier has a wholesome respect he says; Churchill has all the moral courage which Lloyd George lacks, but none of the latter's tact in negotiation or caution in acting. He will never be in opposition to Lloyd George if the latter can prevent it.

Lord Derby, according to this writer, has exactly what Winston Churchill lacks, namely a following in the country.

The author of "Pomp and Power" regretfully declares that one of Premier Lloyd George's chief weaknesses is his sensibility to newspaper criticism.
