COLLIER SUNK IN COLLISION.
PROVIDENCE, To-day.
The Colonial Line steamer Concord from New York for Providence, is reported to have collided with a collier in Narragansett Bay early to-day. The collier was sunk.

Schooner Sunk Off Cape Race.

CREW ALL SAVED.
While coming from the Grand Banks to the land for a supply of bait the Lunenburg banking schooner Metapedia was cut down and immediately sunk by the Norwegian steamer Drot, off Cape Race, yesterday afternoon. Her crew of seventeen men, some of whom were only partly dressed at the time of the collision were all saved and brought to port by the steamer Drot which arrived this morning. A thick fog prevailed at the time the accident occurred which was at 1.30 p.m. The vessel was about 5 miles off the land, and was bearing about 30 miles north east of Cape Race. The Metapedia was commanded by Capt. B. Mason and had about 300 quintals of codfish on board. The steamer came from New York and is commanded by Capt. J. J. Dainton. As already mentioned the crew of the vessel were only partly clad at the time of the impact, and they may be considered pretty fortunate to have escaped with their lives. Those who were off watch were in their berths sleeping and when their vessel was struck they had to jump for their lives, several of those who were rescued being without coats or boots. In the absence of the Minister of Marine and Fisheries the shipping men are being looked after by the Customs authorities and some of them will likely be sent to their homes by the Florizel this afternoon.
