

MERCANTILE MARINE.

MEMORIAL PLAQUE and SCROLL.

His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to sanction a Memorial being presented to the next-of-kin of all those Members of the Mercantile Marine who have lost their lives through enemy action while serving on British Ships and to the next-of-kin of British Members of the crews of neutral or allied vessels under the direct control of the Admiralty who have lost their lives through enemy action while serving on such vessels, between the 4th of August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918. This Memorial is to take the form of a Bronze Plaque emblematic of design, and a parchment scroll with appropriate wording, each of which will bear the deceased's christian name and surname. The Memorials will be accompanied by a letter from His Majesty and are to be regarded as a gift from His Majesty the King.

Application should be made to the Customs' Officer, in the same manner as application for the British War Medal and Mercantile Marine Medal.
