**Grape-Fruit Jelly**

1 envelope Knox Gelatine	2 cups grape fruit juice and pulp
1/2 cup cold water	2 tablespoonfuls lemon juice
1 cup boiling water	1 cup sugar

### Winston Churchill Advocates New Alliance--Sir James Craig Defines Ulster's Attitude--Dominion Coal Company Curtailing Operations.

do not say Ulster will never accept an all Ireland Council, though Sinn Fein says it will never accept any other scheme." Sir James is quoted as saying, "What we say is, let Sinn Fein prove its ability to govern itself along constitutional lines. Let it win Ulster's confidence by practical proof of its fairness and impartiality toward Southern Unionists." Sir James was quoted as outlining imaginary reasons of oppression, such as enforcement of Catholic teaching through educational legislation. Another supposition was that Sinn Fein, "with its lack of experience in industrial affairs might easily wreck Ulster's important industries by ill-considered legislation."

**BRITAIN'S ONE PURPOSE.**  
LONDON, Nov. 29. An authorized statement, issued by Reuters says in part, "apprehensions expressed in various directions concerning proceedings at the Washington Conference are not shared in authoritative British circles. While the possibility of differences of opinion arising and temporary setbacks being experienced is not lost sight of, the British view is one of real satisfaction, and great hope, for on several questions alone more has been done than most people, before the opening of the conference, would have been prepared to expect. So far as Great Britain is concerned, the United States summons in every direction, in the general purpose of ridding the world of the menace of war."

**GLAEM BEHIND THE GLOOM.**  
LONDON, Nov. 29. Admission of the possibility that some day coalfields of their own free will in the Government of all Ireland, is ascribed to Sir James Craig, Premier, in an interview published to-day by the Daily Mirror.

**ITALIAN DESTROYER LOST.**  
LONDON, Nov. 29. The Italian destroyer Contraro has gone down in the Mediterranean Sea, off Port Adalia, during a storm according to a despatch from Brindisi to the Daily Mail.

**DISASTROUS FIRE IN MONTREAL.**  
MONTREAL, Nov. 29. Forty families are homeless and thirty-three tenements are in ruins as the result of a disastrous fire on 9th Avenue, Rosemount, here to-day.

**ANOTHER BOMB OUTRAGE.**  
BELFAST, Nov. 29. One man was killed and two injured by an explosion to-night when a bomb was thrown from the railway embankment into a street in Low Market District.

**SAILORS WOULD NOT OBJECT.**  
NEW YORK, Nov. 29. The sailors are perfectly willing to have their fleets cut down, Admiral Beatty told the Lawyers' Club to-day. Those who served in the war had seen something of its devastation and would be glad to see war made impossible.

**COMPANY HELD RESPONSIBLE.**  
VANCOUVER, Nov. 29. At the close of the inquest yesterday responsibility for the flood which wiped out the town of Britannia Beach several weeks ago and caused the death of thirty-six persons is placed upon the Britannia Mining and Smelting Co., which has head offices in New York, and which operates the copper mines at Britannia. The cause of the flood is shown to be in the railroad fill on the mountain behind the town, placed in such a way as to cause the damming an ultimate overflow of the mountain streams.

**TURKISH MUNITIONS CAPTURED.**  
PARIS, Nov. 29. An Athens despatch to the Havas Agency to-day says a Greek cruiser has intercepted off the Ionian Island of Cephalonia, a steamer bound south for Adalia, Southwestern Asia Minor with munitions alleged to be intended for the Turkish Nationalist Army. A search of the steamer revealed, it is stated, nine Italian airplanes, two million cartridges and other war material.

**AN ULSTER OEGAN.**  
LONDON, Nov. 29. Preparations are being made to publish a newspaper with morning and evening editions, devoted to the cause of Ulster, according to the Daily Mirror.

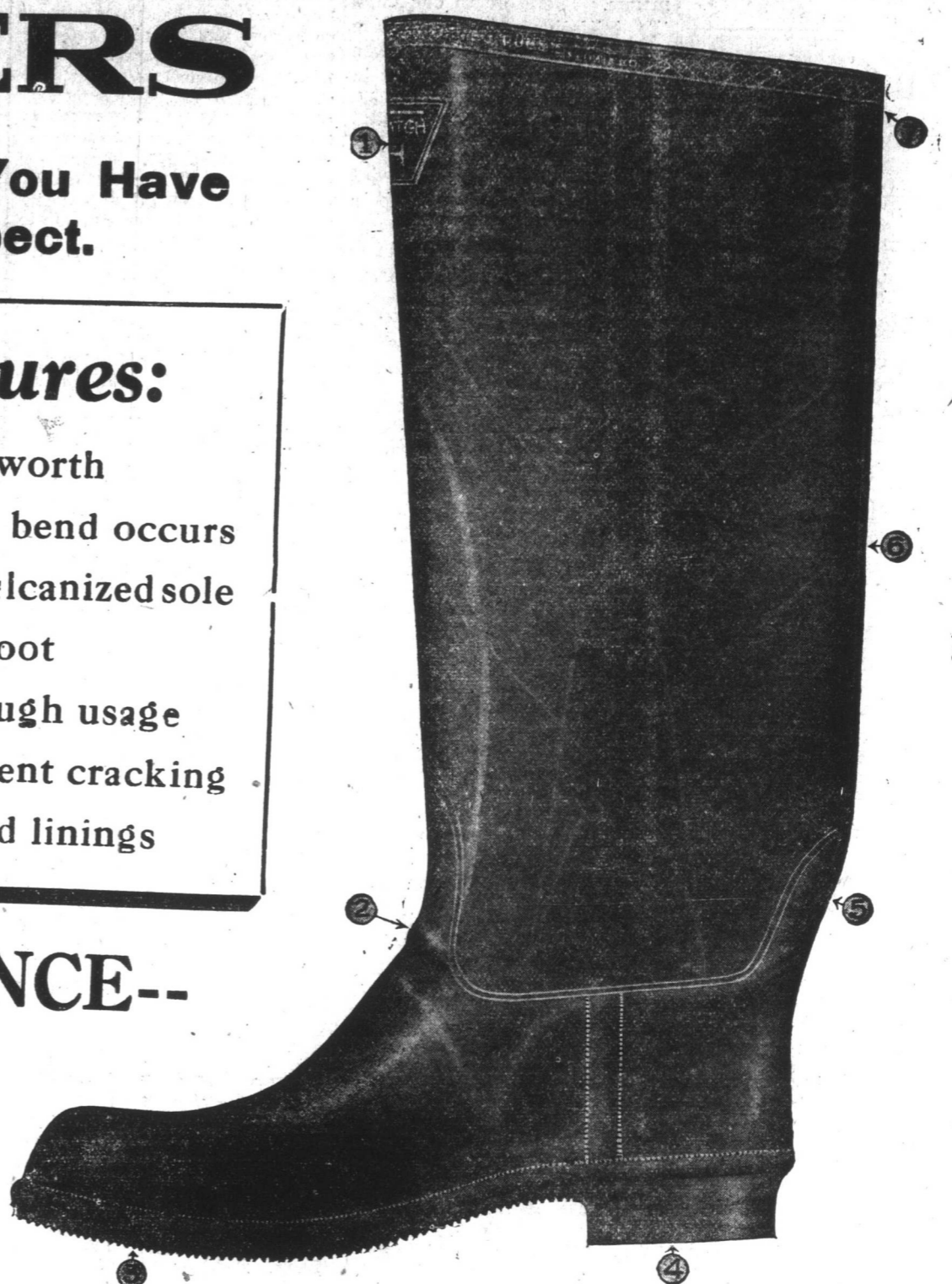

**Rare Tree.**  
Introduction in the United States of the chainmoogra to assure a permanent supply of the oil for the treatment of leprosy inaugurated by the Canadian authorities at their lazarettos, is planned as a result of a trip through Siam, Burma and Assam by Prof. J. F. Rock, formerly of the University of Hawaii.

Professor Rock has just returned to Washington after an extensive exploration into the jungles for the department of agriculture's branch of foreign seed and plant introduction. He brought back with him several specimens of the "arakogenos" tree, the seeds of which have been sent to various experiment stations of the department in Florida, Maryland and California for germination.

Within eight years, it is believed, enough fruit will be borne from these plants to initiate a domestic source of supply of chainmoogra oil.

With the possible exception of a man named Kerr, an amateur botanist, Professor Rock is said to be the first white man to invade the region of Siam where he obtained his specimens. Natives of that country for many years had visited the tarakogenos forests to obtain of the oil to meet their domestic needs, but they made these trips only every three years for fear of the beasts that inhabit the wild country.

While chainmoogra oil has been used scientifically for only a few years, Professor Rock said the natives of that part of Asia which he visited have been using the curative properties of the tarakogenos tree for hundreds of years, but in such a crude way as to be unable to derive its complete benefits.


"In the Buddhist histories that date back one thousand years there is mention of this tree," Professor Rock pointed out, adding that "the crude oil of the tree was taken internally by the lepers and the legends say it was effective."

It was not until 1899 that the active principles of the oil from the seeds of the tarakogenos tree were isolated with success. This was done by Dr. Frederick B. Powers, now connected with the department of agriculture, after extensive scientific experiments made in England in 1888 had resulted in the discovery that the wrong tree was being used for extracting chainmoogra oil.


**Things Not Always What They Seem.**  
North Dakota has recanted. Once upon a time, and not so very long ago either, the electorate of that State entertained the idea of getting away from he old and tried methods of living. In a word they resolved to go in for State ownership. They created the Bank of North Dakota and incidentally drove out its rivals by adverse legislation; they started in to build mills and elevators and created a Home Builders' Association. These, of course, were all State institutions. Recently North Dakota held an election, the result of which was the turning out of office of the State ownership crowd and incidentally refusing to endorse the issuance of \$7,750,000 bonds which had it become law would have been utilized for the following purposes: To liquidate the Bank of North Dakota, to complete a mill and elevator and to wind up the affairs of the Home Builders' Association. The

electors also defeated a rural credits enactment. As the Bismarck "Tribune" remarks editorially: "It is a logical, if not a political deduction, that the people of North Dakota are against shooting any more tax money against the idea of getting away from the conclusion that State ownership will bring no relief, and they are turning away from its theories." There is nothing like a practical demonstration to finally convince people that "things are not always what they seem." And the North Dakota venture into the realms of Socialism is of particular interest just now in view of what some of our own politicians newspapers have been telling the public for some time back. "The only way," concludes the "Tribune," that the credit of North Dakota can be re-established is to tell the world that this State is through with Socialism."—Saturday Night.
