Unmistakable Signs.

The signs that are being put up by those prominent in Government circles indicate that there is something on the move. The cohorts are being assembled and instructions are being ladled out to the supporters, coupled with strict orders to be in readiness when the hour for action is announced. Great activity prevails in the camp of the Government's organizer-in-chief, and hurried and frequent visits are being made by night and day to the near-by outposts. Preparations are said to be proceeding at a rapid rate, and though an air of mystery overhangs the goings and comings, yet it is whispered in well informed circles that all the unusual and half concealed energy being spent—not to speak of public money—but presages a fall election. The signs have been visible for quite a number of months, but only recently has it developed that the Administration leaders contemplate an appeal to the electorate, providing their plans and arrangements do not "gang agley." Propagandist work has been going on in the northern districts, and an exhibition of modern spellbinding has been a feature of the campaign. The vehement denials too of the Advocate that the idea of an election is not even being considered also gives rise to a suspicion that the wealth of language used in contradiction of the reports is only a cover up. There is not, cannot be, the slightest doubt that if it is considered expedient and of ultimate advantage to the present Government, its personnel will not hesitate to stake their future on the hazard of a cast of the political die this fall. The Humber and possibly kindred propositions will be the attractive bait used for the occasion. Other signs are still more unmistakable. Feverish energy is being directed in the district of St. John's West, a Minister of the Crown being particularly active in that section. If straws show the direction of the wind, then indeed there is something doing in political quarters, else why the constant peregrinations of the political pulse feelers throughout most of the districts which returned Government candidates in 1919?

Film Company Organized in P.E.I.

SHIPMAN ASSEMBLES DIRECTORATE.

A Secret No Longer.

GOVERNMENT CONTEMPLATE EARLY ELECTION.

Color is given the rumor that there will be an election this fall by the lavish expenditures now going on in various districts, and particularly in St. John's West. It is said that over \$200,000 have been expended in St. John's within the past twelve months, ostensibly as relief measures. Other districts have not fared so well, and if rumor is correct some of the rank and file of the Government are expressing themselves forcibly. In this connection it is said the junior member for Burin district has arrived in the city, and as an outcome a special allocation of between six and seven thousand dollars has been made for his district within the past 48 hours. The statement that a voters' list has been compiled from the census returns appears to be correct, it being the intention of the Government should an election during the fall be decided upon, to keep the matter a secret and send the lists at last possible moment to the various districts for revision. The whole matter appears to be contingent on the success of the Humber negotiations, but as yet this matter has not been finalized, although it is reported that Sir Richard Squires will be returning home early in September.

The game, as the score shows, was quite good and both sides played hard throughout. There was, however, a lot of very wild shooting. Stole Boots.

SIX MONTHS FOR LARCENY.

Charged with the larceny of eight pairs of boots from Parker & Monroe to the value of \$48, two young men pleaded guilty in the Police Court this morning. Accused broke into the West End Store of Parker & Monroe, entry being made through an office window. Four pairs of boots have not yet been recovered. Sentence of six months' imprisonment without the option of a fine was imposed.

One of the accused in this case, with another man, was charged also with the robbery of a boat and other goods at Brigus. Both pleaded guilty to the larceny of the boat but not the other articles. Accused sailed over from Brigus to Kelligrews in the boat and they left it there. A West End shopkeeper recited off a list of articles supposedly stolen from his store. This ranged from Sunlight soap down to pork and beans. Each of the accused received sentence of six months' imprisonment on the charge.
