n duty free. The duty on st coal and oil for making ill for making lines and twines come in twines are duty free, and the sales tax about six per cent. As the Rope walk pays three per cent. on the gross receipts from lines and twines, there is no protection there. Imported cord-age pays about two and, two third cents per ib. Nets imported pay in duty and tax about 34 per cent. As most of the material for the manufacture of these two last named articles like that for making lines and twines, is free of duty, there is some measure of protection for local factory-made nets and cordage.

From the figures above quoted it will be readily seen that some articles of local manufacture are well protected and some receive little or no protection at all. If the principle of protection is to be admitted at all it should be applied more fairly and equitably. The figures I have given are fairly approximate and are gained more from personal knowledge than from a study of the published figures of the Customs Blue Book. It is to be hoped that the Tariff Commission will arrange the new Tariff so that statistics may be kept that will be of greater/value to trade and industry. This could be done without materially increasing the work of the Customs Staff. I shall next deal with the Capitalists. Yours truly,
