The Philippines on Wheels

WANTON STANLEY WEBB AND HIS CAR OF WONDERFUL EXHIBITS REACH HERE.

The special car of Wanton Stanley Webb was correspondent and oriental traveller, containing exhibits from the Hawaii and Philippine Islands, arrived in town last night. The car is 67 1/2 feet in length with six wheel trucks, air brakes, combination platform and travels only on first-class trains. It was built to order for Mr. Webb and besides being admirably fitted up to show off the exhibits, is equipped with all the comforts of a home, containing buffet, kitchen, office, bed, bath and dining room, and is a model of neatness and convenience. With Mr. Webb are a clerk, porter, steward and press agent. The exhibit contains many wonderful specimens of the Philippine and Hawaiian Islands, both vegetable and mineral. Specimens of native dresses, embroidery, fire arms and countless curiosities illustrative of the character of these islanders, make the car a veritable schoolhouse on wheels. The car is further embellished with plate glass mirrors and many photographs showing native buildings, scenery and army life of natives and United States soldiers during the recent war.—Auburn, N. Electric Lighting Equipment.

USED ON GRAND TRUNK TRAINS, RECEIVED GOLD MEDAL AT PAN-AMERICAN EXPOSITION.

During the summer season the Grand Trunk Railway inaugurated a system of lighting several of its trains by electricity also supplying the dining cars and cafe parlor cars with electric fans, the current used for both the lighting and fan being generated from the axle of the wheels, an innovation very much appreciated by the traveling public. The Consolidated Electric Lighting and Equipment Company, which installed this system, was awarded the gold medal at the Pan-American exposition by a jury composed of railway and electrical experts, after a critical examination of the various car lighting equipments.
