BIHOME RULE UP IN BRITISH HOUSE

Campbell-Bannerman Opposition Leader-Favors Self-Government.

London, April 13.-Home rule for Ireland was discussed at last night's session of the House of Commons. The Government was well represented. Premier Balfour was greeted with ironical Opposition cheers when he entered.

Mr. Tuff (Conservative) called the attention of the house to speeches by certain members of the Opposition on home rule for Ireland, and moved that in view of conflicting statements by various leaders on the subject of home rule, the house deems it expedient for the member for dirlingburgh to explicitly declare wheter it is the intention to recommend to be electors of the United Kingdom the policy of establishing a Parliament in Ire-

seconded the motion.
Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman caustically congratulated Mr. Balfour on his presence in the house when an abstract presence in the house when an abstract motion was up involving "a question which would not come before this Parliament." The speaker declined to give a direct reply to the motion. He said it was not necessary to relate the record of the Liberal party, which, for twenty years, had labored unceasingly to secure good government for Ireland. He said the principle underlying these efforts was that self-government should be granted. He would endeavor to bring this to a successwould endeavor to bring this to a succes

John Redmond declared that Ireland demanded home rule as a right. If there were the smallest chance of success he would not hesitate to advise his countrymen to end the present situation by an armed revolt; but they desired to ter-minate the ancient quarrel upon terms satisfactory and honorable to both nations. He thanked Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman for his declaration, but said the Radical party would find this question an urgent and insistent one, which would knock loudly at the door of the next
