

15,000 PEOPLE AT THE FAIR

Tuesday's Crowd at Queen's Park
Was a Very Large
One.

ATTRACTIONS PLEASED

Races Were of an Exciting Kind—Dog
and Cat Shows Drew Large
Crowds.

Citizens' Day drew a fine crowd to the Fair yesterday, estimated at 15,000. In any event it was a great showing for the second day, and the directors were a well pleased lot of men last night.

It was somewhat of a misnomer to call it Citizens' Day. As a matter of fact, the citizens were largely in the minority.

The visitors from outside places, Aylmer, Elmhurst, St. Thomas, along the Bruce line, Stratford, Guelph, and other cities, were much in evidence, and they crowded the grounds. Practically 5,000 were brought into the city by the railways, and all went to the big fair.

No Accidents.
Everything ran very smoothly yesterday. There was not a hitch in the programme. There was not an accident of any kind reported. The judging was practically all done, and there was little ground for complaint in any quarter.

The red tickets, and the blue tickets scattered over the exhibits, gave them a distinction not seen on previous days, and added much to the attractiveness of the Fair.

The attractions in front of the stand were seen to the very best advantage yesterday. There were no painful waits between each performance. The balloons were clever, and the other feature acts pleased greatly.

The part of the programme was augmented by the appearance of the famous 21st Highlander Band of Hamilton, under the leadership of Bandmaster Sturges.

This organization is always popular when it visits London, and yesterday it added considerably to its reputation. Their music was much enjoyed.

The Cat Show Draws.
The cat show was in full swing yesterday. The number of exhibits is not as great as last year, but the quality suffers nothing in comparison. Some of the cats shown are really magnificent. Dr. J. S. Niven has a particularly fine lot. He has a Crystal Palace winner of London, Eng., among them, Champion Tealby Belle, one of the most beautiful blue Persians ever seen in the city of London. He has several other blues, all pretty, many of them the making of champions. Mr. Art Keene also shows some good ones, while there are many other cats of interest. The pussy from Glanworth, with 25 toes, was admired by many, too.

Dogs Are Popular.
The dog show is worth while. The exhibit is much ahead of last year, or, perhaps, any year since it opened. Col. McEwen and other breeders make a fine display of collies. There are a score or more of these beauties, and they are indeed popular. As for the Boston Bulls, there are many of them, and all of good quality. They are popular, particularly among the ladies. Dr. W. J. Tillmann has his fine string of Russian Wolf Hounds, Toronto winners, on hand, and they swept the

boards. Mr. W. S. J. Saunders also took everything in Dachsunds, as he did in Toronto. Mr. A. H. M. Graydon shows some fine setters, while Mr. Jack Egan swept the boards in Scotch terriers. Mr. Peter Bawden, of Ridgeway, has some good Alredale terriers, and Dr. J. B. Campbell has a fine pair of Bedingtons.

The Races.

The races in the afternoon were good, the fast pace and trot going five heats to a decision. Berlin Belle finally winning. In the first two heats Billy W. was good, and lasted long enough to beat the Belle home. In the third heat Berlin Belle and Cope had a battle royal to the wire for the position, the Berlin mare getting it by an eyelash. After that she was always a little better than Cope, Billy W. faded away. Ernie Crummer's Ray was always a little better than his field, and won first money in straight heats in the slower pace. Robert Margrave was generally good enough for second place. The light horses were judged yesterday, and some very fine animals were shown. McGraha, Miss Wilks' champion prize-winning trotting stallion, was shown, and, of course, swept the boards. He truly is a very handsome horse. The saddle horses and jumpers were also exhibited, there being more interest taken among farmers in this class of horses than formerly.

Mayor McLaren, of Hamilton, and Mayor Guest, of St. Thomas, were among the visitors yesterday. Both were taken in hand by the directors, and given the freedom of the grounds. They were well satisfied with the Fair, and both expressed themselves delighted at being present. There were many other almost as distinguished visitors present also.
